In-class workshop, off-site activity

Length: 120 minutes **Target audience:** 2nd and 3rd cycles of Elementary school – 1st cycle of Secondary school **Educational areas:** Social universe, French, History

DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

Discover the objects from our encounters! Immerse yourself in Indigenous culture through objects in the McCord Stewart Museum's collection. Open the doors of your classroom to Indigenous voices with the **Objects tell their stories** digital education kit. The learning resource relies on an interactive and participative approach to support students as they explore different aspects of Indigenous societies and hear how community members view their thriving traditions, values, and cultures!

Within the framework of an investigation carried out using an object from the Museum's collection (the canoe, the drum, the wampum, or the basket), the Museum's mediator will guide the students in welcoming the Indigenous voice by listening to contemporary testimonies. These voices are many and each testimony sheds new light on the past, present, and future of the Indigenous nations of Quebec.
